### Impact Report for Last Year

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was: £17470. This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below.

Activity	Cost	Impact Assessment
CPD from External Coaches to improve teachers confidence	£4934	Teachers report that they feel more confident delivering sessions including in sports and dance. Children receive a higher quality of sports teaching because of this.
Extra-Curricular opportunities This includes running of lunch time clubs, subsidised after school clubs and activity days.	£6872	Children are more engaged at lunch time in active games. Coaches and other staff run games every lunchtime. Teams have been formed and taken part in some external competitions.
School competitions funding	£150	Support for stickers/medals/certificates etc.
Top-Up Swimming Sessions	£1781	For year 5s who have been unable to swim 25 meters confidently.
Travel support – contribution towards sports travel	£350	This has enabled the school to take part in competitions in the local area.
Resources and equipment	£935	Equipment has provided further opportunities for children to explore new activities e.g. Archery.
<b>External Coaching staff</b>	<b>£2960</b>	This includes coaches teaching Specialist Dance sessions as well as other sports e.g. Handball. Dance was taught to all year 5 and 6 pupils by a qualified dance teacher.
